SAVING THE BULLPASTURE RIVER FIELD

HIGHLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY SUCCESS STORY

The Highland Historical Society will announce at its annual meeting that the nearly two year effort made by the society to save and protect the Bullpasture River Field, a part of the core area of the McDowell Battlefield, is nearing success. This exciting news has been made possible by an almost unprecedented outpouring of support by Highland County resident and non-resident landowners, descendants of Highlanders, and history-loving friends of the county alike.

Early in the fund-raising campaign, society Life Member Louisa Barry made a generous offer to match the first fifty \$100. donations made to save the field by either descendants of Highland countians, or by non-resident landowners. The fiftieth "match" was made on December 16, 1999, thus giving the fund-raising

(BULLPASTURE FIELD - con't from page 1) campaign a terrific boost of a total of \$10,000.

The well-known Civil War artist Bradley Schmehl, who painted "Reconnaissance at McDowell" offered some of his Artist Personal Proofs of the prints of "Reconnaissance at McDowell" to the society at half of their cost, allowing the society to sell them and put the profits to the Save the Field Fund.

In addition to a fundraising mailing to all county landowners, the society put all profits from the 1999 McDowell Battlefield Days into the Fund. McDowell Battlefield Days T-shirts were sold, and those proceeds also were put toward saving the Field.

The generous support of hundreds of Highlanders and friends also included Civil War reenactors who had learned of the county through McDowell Battlefield Heritage Days and who gave their support by both direct donations and by participation in three separate preservation events: The Bentonville March, The Kelly's Ford Reenactment, and the Preservation March 2000 held in October 2000.

The society also sold a conservation easement on the property: thus the property is preserved and protected for all time! The Highland Historical Society hereby gratefully acknowledges the support and encouragement given by so very many special and wonderful people!!!

3RD HIGHLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED TO JUSTIN WHITE

The Highland Historical Society awarded its third annual scholarship to Highland High School graduating senior Justin White, class of 2000.

MCDOWELL BATTLEFIELD HERITAGE DAYS - 2001

The fourth McDowell Battlefield Heritage Days, sponsored by the Highland Historical Society and the Highland Chamber of Commerce, will be held on the weekend of May 5-6, 2001.

The event, which draws visitors and reenactors from across the county, is expected to be an even larger one than in previous years, and will feature almost 1000 reenactors.

There will be horse-drawn wagon tours of the area, various lectures on the period, crafts, demonstrations, and living history presentations throughout the weekend.

The Highland Historical Society will once again present an authentic costuming workshop in February to assist interested persons beginning to prepare outfits in time for the event. The date will be announced in The Recorder.

"Sarah Ellen MacDowell" is the name of this doll which is presently on her year-long journey to various "heirloom" seamstresses throughout the country. At the end of her journey, on May 5-6, 2001, she and her outfits will belong to some lucky person whose ticket has been chosen at random.

Elizabeth Stewart Clark, an heirloom seamstress in Idaho, conceived of the doll idea as a way to raise money for the preservation of Civil War sites. She put the information on her website, and the doll raffle idea was an immediate success.
