



The sixth McDowell Battlefield Heritage Days was held on the weekend of May 7-8, 2005.

We are starting the fund-raising with this newsletter, and will continue the effort in 2006. If our efforts are not successful, all donations will be returned to the donors upon request, or applied to the Highland Museum Fund.
